Repeater System Usage Rules

The Splitrock Amateur Radio Association expects all users of the club repeater to follow these rules.

Usage: The Splitrock repeater system is an open, user-friendly and visitor-friendly repeater, which serves many purposes. It is operated in compliance with the FCC Part 97 Rules.

Priority: Emergency traffic has priority over anything else. The order of priority on the repeater system is, in decreasing order - Emergency traffic, Maintenance & Testing, Public Service traffic, Splitrock Nets, routine Amateur Radio conversations.

Always identify your station in accordance with the FCC regulations.

Give consideration to other users when in a lengthy conversation, i.e., leave pauses between transmissions for others to join in on the conversation, or make a call.

Our repeater is "G"- rated 24 hours a day. There shall be absolutely no communications containing obscene, indecent or profane words, language or meaning. Conversations on the repeater should be friendly, courteous ones.

No one shall cause or condone the malicious or intentional interference of anyone on the repeater.

Operators shall not recognize, communicate with, or discuss the actions of anyone who violates these rules. Members are encouraged to report any violation to the Splitrock Board or the Trustee.

The appointed Control Operators are required to turn off the repeater to terminate improper operation of any sort, be it equipment malfunction or operator caused.

The Splitrock Amateur Radio Association reserves the right to forbid the use of the repeater by anyone who repeatedly violates either the FCC Rules or these rules, or anyone who facilitates or encourages others to violate the rules.
